- **#6**. Review finances, make a business plan and fundraise.
- **#5**. Get to know the four nearest teams call. email. visit. etc.
- #4. Team building exercises, mini-robot design/ build activities.
- #3. Recruit and train new members.
- **#2**. Community service projects.
