We are hoping to invite 48 teams to the state championship tournament which will require teams to check in and go through judging on Friday night. The tournament will start at 9 AM Saturday morning, if all goes according to plans.

FIRST ETIQUETTE

FIRST – is an acronym. It is not spelled F.I.R.S.T. nor First. LEGO is spelled with all capital letters. When referring to your team, especially with the press and social media, refer to your team as FIRST Jr. LEGO League, FIRST LEGO League, FIRST Robotics Competition. After referencing the full name, then it would be appropriate to use the shortened version of Jr.FLL, FLL, FTC and FRC.

Official logos for *FIRST* and all *FIRST* programs are available for your use. There are policies for their use. Information may be found on the *FIRST* website under *FIRST* Brand.

TIMS

The Team Information Management System is open for registration for all *FIRST* programs. Teams are encouraged to verify the coach/mentor contact info is accurate. If there are additions to your mentoring staff, ensure they are acknowledged as a part of your team.

FTC and FRC teams affiliated with a school may want to consider inviting the guidance counselor as a scholarship contact to be kept informed of scholarships for our *FIRST* robotic students.

FUNDRAISING

August is a great time for many teams to do some fundraising before school starts to avoid overlap with PTA/PTO, clubs, and sports. Several restaurant chains such as Applebee's, Chick-fil-A, Chili's, Chipotle, Culver's, Red Robin and TCBY all offer fundraising spirit nights. Most have an application process. Once accepted, your team will be responsible to distribute promotional flyers and/or advertise to your community to get as many people as possible to attend on your fundraiser date. There is no cost; the restaurant donates a percentage of sales back to your team. This may also be a great outreach opportunity if the restaurant will allow you to showcase your team's robot.

JOHN DEERE GRANTS

John Deere offers grants for *FIRST* teams located within 50 miles of their facilities in the Quad Cities, Champaign, or Dubuque (IA). If your team has a John Deere employee or retiree as a mentor, the distance can be even farther. <u>Application</u> deadlines are approaching.

FIRST FUTURE INNOVATOR AWARD

The FFIA competition is open to all FTC and FRC members. The award recognizes creativity in solving a real world, complex problem through the invention of a unique solution. Submission deadline is October 30.

FTC SERVOCITY SPONSORSHIPS

August 31 is the deadline to apply for one of five \$1,000 sponsorships for FIRST FTC teams by ServoCity.
